In July, the Upstate Photography Biennial continues at **CPW** (25 Dederick St., Kingston), bringing together contemporary photographic work from across upstate New York. CPW's gallery hours are Thursday through Sunday, 11am to 5pm. If you haven't been to CPW yet, it's a phenomenal gallery space featuring a diverse selection of impressive work that can go lens-to-lens with any NYC art space.

At **Woodstock Artists Association Museum** (28 Tinker St., Woodstock), the inaugural Outdoor Sculpture Park Exhibition continues through the summer. WAAM's summer gallery hours are Wednesday through Sunday, 12pm to 5pm, with Monday and Tuesday closed. When the weather's nice, make it a stop on your stroll through Woodstock.

The Lyra Artist Concert comes to **Howland Cultural Center** (477 Main Street, Beacon) on Thursday, July 2 at 7pm. Avery Morris, Natalia Vilchis and Diyi Tang perform a piano-trio program that moves from Mozart and Mendelssohn to Prokofiev, Toussaint and Copland, a lineup that should appeal to any fan of chamber music.

On Friday, July 3 at 6:30pm, **Stone House Tavern** (4802 Route 209, Accord) hosts the intellectual roots-rock of Bryan Dunn, an Olivebridge-based songwriter known for sharp wordplay, bright hooks and infectious energy. Disney's *Newsies* opens its July run at **Woodstock Playhouse** (103 Mill Hill Road, Woodstock), bringing the newspaper boys' labor rebellion back to the stage. At **Outpost BBQ** (6611 Route 209, Kerhonkson), Noplace Nowhere plays honky-tonk from 7 to 9pm – it's the perfect summer-night blend of barbecue, dancing and Americana. The Pink Floyd Project lands at **Colony Woodstock** (22 Rock City Road, Woodstock) the same night, aimed at listeners who want the scale and texture of classic album rock in an intimate setting.

On Saturday, July 4, **Lydia's** (7 Old Route 209, Stone Ridge) hosts a Fourth of July celebration with the Nancy Donnelly Quartet from 7 to 10pm. The event is outdoors, weather permitting, with buffet and dancing. The next night, Sunday, July 5, Ricardo Lemvo and Makina Loca bring Afro-Cuban dance music to **Opus 40** (356 George Sickie Rd., Saugerties) at 7:30pm; Lemvo's blend of Congolese rumba, Cuban son and salsa rhythms are perfect

On Wednesday, July 8, Chuck Ragan performs at **Bearsville Theater** (291 Tinker Street, Woodstock) with Laura Stevenson in what should be a brilliant display of punk-rooted songwriting, weathered voices and emotional directness. Parr’s country-blues and folk vocabulary should fit the barn’s intimate, history-saturated room, while Raymond’s instrumental guitar work adds a sharper, more exploratory edge. That same evening, the Second Thursday Open Mic at **High Falls Cafe** (2842 Route 209, Kingston) offers the opposite end of the performance spectrum: neighbors testing songs, jokes, and poems in public.

On Friday, July 10, **UPAC** (601 Broadway, Kingston) don’t miss rock legends Band of Horses and Dinosaur Jr. at 8pm. Band of Horses is famous for its spacious, melodic indie rock, and Dinosaur Jr. are loud and fuzzy lords of alternative music’s late-20th-century underground. Also at 8pm, **Assembly** (236 Wall Street, Kingston) presents

Charlene Kaye: Diversity Shredder. Kaye has gone viral for her unique wit, guitar-shredding chops and chaotic musical comedy.

Saturday, July 11 offers several different avenues into art. **Catskill Mountain Shakespeare** (7970 Main Street, Hunter) opens *Much Ado About Nothing* under the tent behind the Red Barn, with evening performances continuing through July 26. Shakespeare’s comedy of wit, rumor, gender performance and public embarrassment tends to age well because its social machinery still feels painfully recognizable. At **Phoenicia Playhouse** (10 Church Street, Phoenicia), the Flying Cat Music Series presents Caroline and Tom as part of the playhouse’s community-first 50th anniversary season. Irish traditional musicians Caroline Keane and Tom Delany bring concertina and uilleann pipes to a smaller-scale concert rooted in the music they grew up with, shaped

by the duo’s years performing, teaching and composing together since meeting at the University of Limerick in 2010. Meanwhile, did you know **Woodstock School of Art** (2470 Route 212, Woodstock) offers a variety of workshops for budding artists? Running at various dates and times in July are classes on abstraction, color and composition, light and shadow and other techniques.

Also Saturday, July 11, Frank Oz’s *Little Shop of Horrors* gets the shadow-cast treatment at **Rosendale Theatre** (408 Main St., Rosendale) as The Apoca-Lips Cast performs the 1986 cult musical about a shy florist, a doomed crush and a carnivorous plant. Best known for its long-running *Rocky Horror* shows, the Hudson Valley troupe adds an interactive edge to the screening. The “Fairy Tales” exhibition also opens July 11 at **Olive Free Library** (4033 Route 28A, West Shokan) and runs through September 5. As a juried

summer group show, it gives artists a durable narrative structure to push against: folklore, childhood memory, myth, danger, transformation and the strange moral logic of old stories.

The **Arm of the Sea** (61 East Bridge Street, Saugerties) summer calendar includes a program titled “One Blue Sky” at the Tidewater Center on Wednesday, July 15 from 6 to 8pm, part of the Waterfront Wednesday series. Arm of the Sea’s large-scale visual theater centers around ecological themes conveyed by massive masks, puppets, music and image as much as by words.
